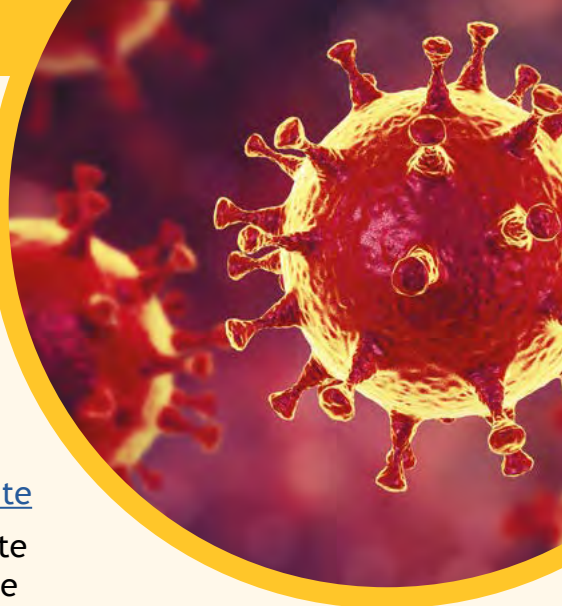

Healthwatch Derbyshire is an independent voice for the people of Derbyshire. We listen to what people have to say about their experiences of using health and social care services and feed this information through to those responsible for providing the services. We also ensure bosses are held to account for how they use this feedback to influence the way services are designed and run.

By gathering as much feedback as we can we are able to identify common themes or trends in what people are telling us, this may result in us highlighting a particular issue that has emerged. For example we might find that a number of individuals have complained about poor access to a GP practice in Derbyshire, we can then flag this up with the GP Practice and ask them how they intend to address the issue.

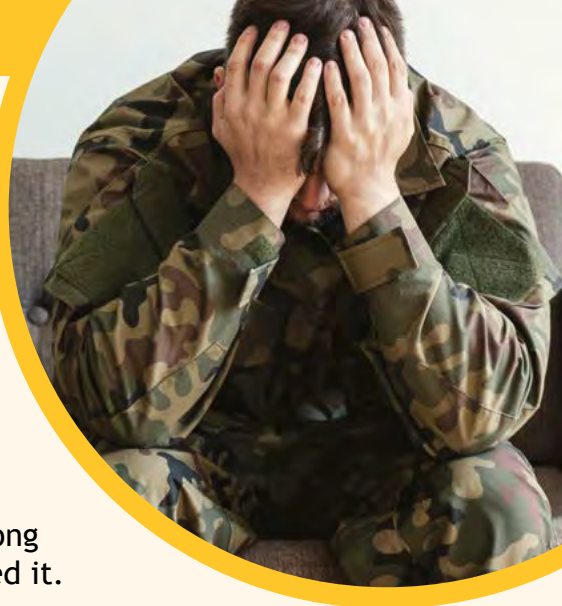
Alcohol service dedicated to Derbyshire's ex-forces community, covering the whole of Derbyshire (except for Derby city).
