

Incident Activity

1,550 incidents attended between January and March, just **8%** up on the average 

6,800 incidents attended in 2021/22, **950** more incidents than last year, but only slightly above the average

In Q4, our crews attended **500** fire incidents, an increase of **5%** on last year

During the year we attended  **2,400** fires an increase of **120** on last year 

Malicious False Alarms

We attended **32** hoax fire calls in Q4 and **94** during the year, distracting our crews from potential life-threatening situations 

Operational Assurance

During the year **24** training exercises were undertaken and **63** station assurance visits were completed this year

Casualties and Fatalities

1 accidental fire death in Q4 with **6** people hospitalised with injuries from accidental fires


4 people died during the year **26** hospitalised during the year, our lowest year on record 

Protection Activities

We attended **144** fires in commercial buildings during the year, our **2nd** lowest outturn on record, our crews and protection teams visited over **7,000** commercial properties in Derbyshire to identify any potential risks to crews and to ensure compliance with fire regulations 

Incident Response

In Q4, **8,800** emergency calls were answered by Joint Control staff achieving an average call handling time of **83** seconds to P1 and P2 fires

In total **39,000** emergency calls this year achieving an **86** second call handling time. Our best annual outturn 

In Q4, our first pumps arrived at **90%** of life-risk fires within **10** minutes of being mobilised, achieving **80%** for the whole year 

This year, our On-Call appliance availability was **81%** while wholetime pumps were available more than **99%** of the time



Accidental Dwelling Fires

377 accidental dwelling fires attended during 2021/22 which is our **2nd** lowest outturn on record 



88 accidental dwelling fires in Q4

84% of houses that had an accidental fire in 2021/22 had a smoke alarm fitted



32 accidental dwelling fires this year were caused by smoking, but cooking remains the biggest cause -



183 cooking fires in the home



Emergency Special Services

DFRS attended over **400** emergency special service incidents in Q4, 
1,700 during the whole year, almost **100** less than the average 

Deliberate Fires

Crews attended **199** deliberate fires in Q4 with spike in late March, in total we attended **980** this year



Road Traffic Collisions (RTCs)

20 people were killed or seriously injured at RTCs attended by DFRS during Q4.

During the year **11** people were killed and **81** seriously injured in RTCs we attended - a **6%** reduction on the 5 year average



Prevention Activities

In Q4 we delivered over **3,400** Safe and Well checks to vulnerable people in Derbyshire and just under **13,500** during the year

An additional **960** were delivered by our Partner Agencies



People

By the end of the year **13%** of our operational workforce were from under-represented groups and **10.3%** of our operational workforce were female 

33% of our wholetime recruits had engaged with our Positive Action Programme 

During quarter 4, we recorded **3.1** average shifts lost  to sickness, **10.3** average shifts during the year

9 injuries and **14** near hits reported by our staff this year

We fitted just over **1,800** smoke alarms in Q4 and over **7,500** throughout the year, over **250** people were referred on to other agencies to help support their Health and Wellbeing this year
